THE PROFESSOR

Daniel Turp currently holds the status of « Professor honoraire » of the [Faculty of Law of the Université de Montréal](#) and continues to supervise doctoral theses. He is a graduate of the Université de Sherbrooke, Université de Montréal, University of Cambridge and holds a PhD from the Université de droit, d'économie et de sciences sociales de Paris (Paris II) (*summa cum laude*). He is the first Quebecer to have obtained the prestigious diploma of [The Hague Academy of International Law](#), where he was also a Director of studies and a Visiting professor.

From 1982 to 2020, he taught public international law, international and constitutional law of fundamental rights and advanced constitutional law. He has also been a visiting professor at several Quebec and Canadian, French and European universities as well as at the [International Institute of Human Rights](#) in Strasbourg.

He is Chairman of the Board of Directors of the [Société québécoise de droit international](#) (SQDI) and of the Conseil d'orientation of the [Réseau francophone de droit international](#) (RFDI). He is also President of the [Association québécoise de droit constitutionnel](#) (AQDC).

He is the author of several monographs and articles in international law and constitutional law, including [*La Constitution québécoise : Essais sur le droit du Québec de se doter de sa propre loi fondamentale*](#) and [*The Right to Choose: Essays on Quebec's Right to Self-Determination*](#).
